Crestwood School GCSE Results

Crestwood are delighted to celebrate the success of this year's Year II GCSE and BTEC results.

We are pleased to announce that our year II cohort have achieved some fantastic results, with another increase in the number of students achieving five or more passes including English and Maths. Whilst there has been a return to pre-COVID levels nationally, we have seen a significant increase in our school's results and pupils should be proud of their achievements. Special congratulations go to Oliver, who achieved three grade 9's, four 8's and two 7's and Amirab, who made the most progress of any pupil. We are so proud that all of the efforts and hard work put in by students has been recognised with some excellent results.

Joining our School



We work hard to ensure a smooth transition from primary school. This includes visits to every primary school by a member of the Senior Leadership Team and an induction day in July when children meet up with others in their form group, meet their new form tutor and experience some taster lessons.

During Year 5 and Year 6 many children will already have visited Crestwood for taster lessons, use of the swimming pool and other special events. Children hear more about their new school and ask any questions they have during these visits. They get to meet "Buddies" who are attached to their form group to support them during the first few days and weeks at Crestwood. We talk to Year 6 teachers to get as much information as possible to help us place the children into well balanced form groups which give every child the opportunity to make new friends and have a fresh start in a new and different environment.

Induction Evening, held on the night before the first Induction Day, gives parents and children the opportunity to meet our Headteacher, Phillip Sutton, senior staff, their Head of Year and most importantly their form tutor. During this evening further information is provided about the new term and any last minute worries and concerns can be addressed. The experience of moving from primary to secondary school is unique for each child but whether your child joins us knowing others from primary school, or comes to us on their own, within a week or so most will have become settled and confident, allowing them to make the most of the opportunities we have to offer.

The transition from primary school is a major event in the life of any child and it is only natural that they will experience a mixture of emotions. Sometimes parents can feel these emotions more acutely than their children, but with staff, Buddies and Ambassadors on hand ready to help, we feel that whatever the difficulty, we have someone who is ready and willing to help establish a secure foundation for your child's future happiness, security and achievements.

Crestwood Curriculum



Putting in place the appropriate curriculum for each child is vital if they are to achieve their best. The curriculum at Crestwood is broad and balanced and Ofsted recognised that we have 'an ambitious curriculum that is well planned and sequenced'.

KEY STAGE 3:

Years 7 & 8

In Years 7 and 8 students spend a significant amount of time studying English and Mathematics. We believe that these subjects are vital in developing skills needed in other subjects and for life outside and beyond school. On entering the school students are taught in a mixture of form groups or sets. Core subjects such as Mathematics, English and Science have learning sets in Year 7 and teaching by ability increases so that students are placed in groups that match their learning needs.

During Years 7 - 8 students study the subjects to the right:

Year 9

With the demands of a new exams system and changing curricula, Year 9 is an increasingly important year for students. Our flexible curriculum in Year 9 is designed to maximise the opportunities for our students.

During the Spring Term, parents and students work with staff to make the choice of subjects that will be followed during Years 10 and 11 at Key Stage 4.

Department presentations for each subject can be found on the school website in the Year 9 curriculum section.

KEY STAGE 4:

Years 10 & 11

Every year we review the curriculum we offer to our students as they move into their final two years at Crestwood. We do this to make sure we offer each student the greatest opportunity to achieve.

All students study a core of English, Mathematics and Science. These subjects form the basis of the curriculum. Most of our students are expected to continue studying one of either a Modern Foreign Language, History, Geography or Computer Science.

In addition to these, our students have the opportunity to select from a wide range of GCSE and vocational subjects.

KEY STAGE 5:

Years 12 & 13

It is our expectation that at the end of KS4 all Crestwood students will continue studying at Post 16. As part of Invictus we are delighted and proud to be able to offer Post 16 education here at Crestwood as part of the Invictus Sixth Form. Students are able to study a wide range of A level and BTEC level



Invictus Education Trust was created in March 2015 by a group of like-minded schools: Crestwood, Ellowes Hall Sports College, Kinver High and Wombourne High School. Two schools have since joined us, Leasowes High School in Autumn 2016 and Pedmore High School in September 2018. Rufford Primary School became the first primary school to join us in September 2021 further strengthening an already thriving Trust.

Collaboration across our Invictus schools is integral to us. We are now fortunate enough to be in a really strong position to have a range of educational settings across our Trust: Primary, Secondary, Sixth Form and Alternative Provision. Although our schools retain their identity, we have built a successful model from which we work closely together in order to learn from each other and share good practice. Our fundamental purpose for this is to ensure our students have the best educational experience possible during their time with us. Our students also have regular opportunities to collaborate through joint learning experiences. This level of partnership makes us quite unique, in comparison to other Multi Academy Trusts, due to our locality and determination to be the best that we can be. Our innovative Invictus Sixth Form, which is open to everyone, is a perfect example of how both staff and students work together simultaneously. Invictus Sixth regularly appears at the top of league tables and leader boards for progress. All of this is made possible by our expert staff and the fact that we ensure all Invictus students are not only transported to their lessons by us but are also equipped with a free laptop and free text books for their studies, throughout their time with us.

Our Invictus Subject Directors are specialist expert leaders who work alongside Heads of Department, and their teams across all of our schools, in order to lead the curriculum and ensure our students receive a quality first education. This model also ensures consistency in learning and a wider support network for our teaching teams. The focus of the directors' work is very much linked to each individual school's context and needs, spanning from Early Years all the way through to Sixth Form! In addition to the curriculum, our Subject Directors also work hard to ensure our students receive fantastic experiences and opportunities. One recent example of this is the fact that students from each secondary school visited Arvon writing Retreat, in Devon working with published poets and authors. This was fully funded by Invictus, championing our passionate writers. Another unique feature to us is that we are the only Education Trust in the country to become an

In addition to this array of opportunities we are also proud to have the very best team of staff to ensure our students' education is at the very highest level. To ensure we keep abreast of local, national and even international research, training sessions for staff are organised, using expertise from both within our Trust and also using external organisations, if needed.

Apart from our academic focus, we are also committed to ensure we provide our students with excellent enrichment and extra curricular propensities. Competition between our schools is tenacious, fierce but fair and when our schools come together to face other schools and Trusts we become formidable! Sport

at Crestwood

Sport in all forms is incredibly popular and successful at Crestwood and we are extremely fortunate in having our own swimming pool and 4G pitch and playing fields. Whatever their level of ability students are encouraged to participate both competitively and socially.

As well as traditional sports including hockey, rugby, football, cricket, netball, rounders, softball and basketball, students are provided with increasing opportunities to add to their experiences with new activities. Numerous clubs complement the core provision and these allow students to take part in an even wider range of activities. They become more proficient and skilled by receiving extra coaching and learn to become umpires, referees and coaches themselves. Students are encouraged to develop their performance to the highest level and many go on to achieve Borough, County and even National status. Year 10/11 students have the opportunity to gain a Cambridge National Sport qualification and Year 10 students can begin to work towards the Crestwood Junior Sports Leader Award. This supports students in developing leadership and coaching skills across a range of sports and activities. We stick to our statement of intent, using this as a tool to develop students' skill and knowledge.

In PE our intent is to develop a curriculum in which students are able to engage with a

multitude of sports in varying capacities and roles so that they are able to recognise how sport can have a positive impact on people's health, and its use for good.

Olympian Programme

Crestwood School is a proudly OVERSUBSCRIBED. This status allows us to offer spaces to students that aren't in our catchment area based on their sporting aptitude.

If your child is currently in year 6 you can apply for a place at Crestwood School on our Olympian Programme. Applicants will be invited to a Talent Identification Day held at the school in the Autumn Term of 2023. Students with the highest scores will be assured of their space at Crestwood School and form our Olympian Team. The Olympian Programme will not affect our local catchment area students, we will be accepting 5% above and beyond our regular spaces for students with high sporting aptitude. Performing Arts Powerhouse







We are now accepting applications for our performing arts programme. 5% of our intake is available to the most talented singers, actors and dancers, regardless of where you live! Information available at our Open Evening.

Over the last few years our Performing Arts team, comprised of our Music, Drama and Dance departments, have pushed the standard of school performances to a level never seen before.

Recent whole school productions include 'Back to the 80's', 'Sister Act' and 'Grease'. Grease was the highlight of 2023 and really demonstrated a thirst for Performing Arts from our students which ranged from Year 7, through to Sixth Form. The feedback and support from our local community is always overwhelming and often results in a waiting list for show tickets! We have an extensive extracurricular programme running alongside of our productions in both Music and Drama consisting of Choir, Gifted and Talented Choir, Boys Choir, Rock Band, Samba Band and Drama Club to name a few. From experiencing an enriched curriculum in both academic and practical Music and Drama, many of our students decide to study both Music and Drama at College and University, with some students gaining places at prestigious Conservatoires, most recently the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts and London based Drama

The passion and enthusiasm from our students has led to a complete overhaul of the Performing Arts Facilities. A brand-new Drama Studio, new Music suite equipped with state-of-the-art Apple Mac computers, a stage, sound, and lighting set up that would not be out of place in a city theatre, 200 capacity retractable seating unit, full air conditioning plus, further facilities and equipment that match our students' talent, which is unrivalled! Upon applying for a place at Crestwood School, Students now have the opportunity to become part of the Performing Arts Programme (Via aptitude test), a specialist programme of activities designed to push our students' talents to their maximum potential.
